Castleberry Independent School District Athletic Code of Conduct



STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

Participation in athletics is an opportunity provided to students who demonstrate a commitment to the classroom. The decision to participate in athletics includes the responsibility of maintaining the high standard of values identified in the Athletic Code of Conduct. Misbehavior will not be tolerated. To be a successful participant in athletics, it is extremely important the student understand the conditions of participation before making the decision to enter the program.

ATHLETIC CODE OF CONDUCT

- ...Violation of the Athletic Code of Conduct will be considered on an individual basis.
- ... You will be treated fairly.
- ... You are an athlete year round.
- ... Comply with school policy.
- ... Conduct yourself as a lady/gentleman at all times.
- ... Always tell the truth.
- ... Do not steal.
- ... Do not make excuses.
- ... Do your best in the classroom.
- ... Respect your teammates.
- ... Do not participate in other non-school related sports while your sport is in season.

 For example: Volleyball players that are in-season may not play club or LYSA volleyball, but may play club or LYSA softball.
- ... Do not use tobacco, alcohol, drugs or any mood-altering chemical.
- ... If you have a concern, talk to your coach in private.

PRIORITIES:

- 1 The number one priority for each student / athlete is academics
- 2 The number two priority of the Castleberry Golf Team is *THE TEAM*. All decisions will have that as the number one factor
- 3 The third priority is to develop, encourage, foster and instill these characteristics in CHS golfers camaraderie, leadership, dependability, discipline, integrity, loyalty, cooperation, and outstanding work ethic
- 4 The fourth priority is to improve the fundamentals, course management, and every player's knowledge of the rules of golf.

Care of the course

- 1 All players must observe course rules and etiquette at all times. At no time is there to be any loud outbursts, profanity, throwing clubs, or damage to the course of any kind. Listed below are some general rules to be aware of while on the course.
- 2 Rake all bunkers Replace all divots (Don't make divots with practice swings)
- 3 On greens, repair all ball marks Repair spike marks on the greens after finishing play Be most careful on the greens, tread lightly, don't damage the hole Do not sit bags on green
- 4 In other words, leave the courses and particularly the greens in the condition in which you would like to find them

Safety

a Be careful when you swing a club, whether in practice (you might hit someone nearby) or in play (you might also hit your ball into someone) Therefore, don't play until the group in front is out of the way

Courtesy

- a Don't move, talk, or stand close to or directly behind a player making a stroke
- b Observe the rules including who has the honor
- c Play without delay Slow play is a huge aggravation. Leave the putting green as soon as all players in your group have holed out
- d Invite faster groups to play through (with the exception of actual tournament play)
- e Don't step in the line of another player's putt
- f Replace the flagstick carefully in an upright position
- g Talking loud or causing distractions to others at practice or other players at the course should be refrained from at all times

*Refusal to adhere to proper golf etiquette or any conduct unbecoming of a Castleberry High School Golfer is cause for immediate removal from the team.

- 1 Players are expected to learn and practice the rules of golf and honorably record and attest to scores in practice and tournaments
- 2 Give your best effort each and every day and on each and every shot. Remember that the next shot you take is the most important one. Unfortunately you cannot replay the previous shot, but you can try to make up for it with the next one.
- 3 Unexcused absences from practice are not permitted. If you have to miss practice either you or your parent/guardian must contact me before practice begins. Do not send your friend to tell me you will not be in attendance. It is your responsibility!

Absences:

*Listed below are the CISD guidelines stating what is considered and excused and unexcused absence as well as the consequences for each

Definition (Excused / Unexcused):

Excused.

- 1 Medical doctor's note + phone call (make-up)
- 2 Illness phone call / email notification (make-up)
- 3 Illness present at practice (no make-up)
 Note must be in attendance 5 out 8 periods (CHS)
- 4 Death in family phone call (no make-up)
- 5 STAAR related (no make-up)
- 6 Family emergencies + phone call/email (make-up)

Unexcused.

- 1. Absences due to Vacation / Thanksgiving / Christmas / Spring Break
- 2. Illness No contact
- 3 Absent from practice No contact
- 4. Attendance Saturday School

DRESS CODE:

- 1. Proper attire is required at every workout and tournament
- 2. Jeans or jean shorts may not be worn for any practice or tournaments
- 3. Sneakers or golf shoes only must be worn to every practice and tournament
- 4 Collared shirts required
- 5 Hats are permitted if they are in good condition and worn properly

^{*}Unexcused absences will result in disqualification for tournament team selection for that week

Women

Acceptable golf attire shall be clean, well-fitted and hemmed pants, shorts or skort with appropriately sleeved collared shirt. Pants, shorts and skorts shall be of appropriate length and adhere to CISD dress code

Men

Acceptable golf attire shall be clean, well-fitted and hemmed pants or shorts with appropriately sleeved collared shirt. Pants and shorts shall be of appropriate length and adhere to the CISD dress code

6 You will not be allowed to participate in practice or tournaments without the appropriate attire. If you miss practice because you do not have proper attire on it will be counted as an unexcused absence

CELL PHONES & PERSONAL LISTENING DEVICES:

- 1 Cell phone and personal listening devices are not permitted during tournament play. If caught using one of these items you will be disqualified per UIL / USGA rules
- 2 Personal listening devices are NOT permitted during practice at any time.
- 3 During practice ONLY may you have your cell phone with you in your golf bag. While playing or practicing I may need to contact you. Check your phone occasionally as sometimes this may happen. You may also need to contact ONLY me.

TEAM SELECTION:

1 Selection of which golfers participate on which team in each tournament will be determined by head to head qualifying, tournament results and daily attendance to practice. A number of factors are used in ranking players on our team. These include but are not limited to attitude, leadership, reliability, trustworthiness, and past performance and statistics at both tournaments and practice.

PARENT GUIDELINES:

- During tournament play parents and interested spectators should be reminded that they are spectators and it is not their responsibility to report possible rule violations. Rule violations should be reported by the players or the marshals of the meet. Parents, friends, and other spectators should stay a substantial distance from competitors during play. After play has started, only coaches may coach "or advise" players. On course encouragement, support, applause, etc. is not considered coaching or advice, therefore, it is permissible.
- 2 As with all programs at CISD the coaching staff with always communicate with you and your son/daughter on ways of improving his/her fundamentals and skills, but the following will not be discussed.
 - -Plaving time
 - -Play calling
 - -Personnel

TOURNAMENT INFO:

- 1 We will leave for tournaments precisely at the time given. It is very important that you are prepared and on time so that we can arrive to the tournament site for the coaches meeting and give you plenty of time to warm up before the start of play
- 2 Do not be late the bus will leave without you if you are not on time.
- 3 Have the necessary items with you for each tournament. clubs, shoes, golf balls, tees, rule book, ball markers (coins), glove(s), ball mark repair tool, band aids, proper attire, wind suit / warm clothes, sunscreen, water bottle, umbrella, chapstick, sharple, snacks to put in your bag, and any other items you may need

DISCIPLINE:

Violation of these team rules will result in suspensions and/or dismissal for the Castleberry High School Golf Team School infractions, classroom misbehaviors, etc. will be dealt with accordingly using the following consequences

1st Offense: 1 tournament suspension

2nd Offense. 1 week suspension

3rd Offense. Removal from team

STANDARD REQUIREMENTS FOR LETTER JACKET RECIPIENTS (GRADES 9 - 12)

When determining letter jacket recipients, sponsors will observe the following standard requirements:

- 1) The student and parent/ guardian must sign the organization's extracurricular participation agreement.
- 2) The student must be considered a participant from the first until the final date of the season.
- 3) The student must remain academically eligible from the first until the final date of the season.
- 4) The student must demonstrate an attitude of commitment while exemplifying the philosophy of the organization.
- 5) The student must be recommended by the sponsor of the organization and approved by the principal and appropriate director.
- 6) Student letter jackets will be provided by the district for approved organizations. Students will receive only one jacket with one varsity letter during their high school career. An additional symbolic award will be presented to a student who earns an additional letter(s) by the corresponding organization. Additional patches will be the financial responsibility of the student.

In addition to the above standard requirements, the sponsor may request that additional requirements be identified for his/her program.

Organization	Dates	Additional Requirements
Football	AugOct.	Play in a minimum of eight (8) quarters at the varsity level.
Cross Country	AugOct.	Participate in three (3) varsity meets and the District Cross Country Meet.
Volleyball	AugOct.	Participate in ten (10) games at the varsity level. Academically eligible.
Basketball	NovFeb.	Participate in ten (10) games at the varsity level.
Track	FebMay	Earn 15 points in the season or 4 point at the District Track Meet.
Baseball	FebMay	Compete in (innings) as total number of games. Example 28 games = 28 innings
Softball	FebMay	Compete in (innings) as total number of games. Example 28 games = 28 innings.
Tennis	FebApr.	Participate in two (2) varsity meets and the District Tennis Meet.
Golf	FebApr.	Participate in two (2) varsity meets and the District Golf Meet.
Athletic Training	AugMay	Standard Requirements (see above).

DESCRIPTION OF AWARDS GRADES 9-12

A participant school or member school district may give an award not to exceed \$70 in value to a student during that student's high school enrollment at the same school for participation in U.I.L. interschool competition. Each year a participant school or member school district may present additional awards, not to exceed \$20 each, for participation in each additional interschool organization.

The major award (\$70) presented to a student participating in the organization in grades 9-12 is a jacket with an attached 5" letter. This award will be presented to the student in the sport in which he/ she first earns a letter. An additional symbolic award will be presented to a student who earns an additional letter/ s. The additional award shall not be given to a student for an activity during the same school year that a major award is earned, if the total award exceeds \$70.

GRADES 7-8

A participant school may not give and a student may not accept awards for participation in interschool competition in excess of \$8 per year (total for all UIL activities). A student may accept a symbolic award in recognition of his / her achievement in an interschool contest if it is given by the organization conducting the contest (all tournament awards, ribbons, plaques, and medals)

Individual certificates of achievement will be presented to students in grades 7 and 8 for each sport in which the student participates and fulfills the Standard Requirements for Award Recipients as identified in this section.
